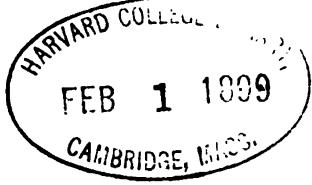

INTRODUCTION.

THE "Catalogue of Tombes of London" was published by Major Payne Fisher in 1668—two years after the Great Fire. The names of the churches where the inscriptions were evident are entirely omitted by Fisher, rendering his work in its original state comparatively useless.

In its present revised form the Catalogue is arranged alphabetically. The original entries in Fisher's catalogue have been retained, while many additions have been made to the work from the best editions of Stow's "Survey of London," etc.

Fisher's original work may be identified by the absence of the name of the church, or where it is added *in square brackets*. The *remainder* of the entries in this catalogue are additions made from the sources named. Further particulars of the inscriptions will generally be found on reference to Stow's "Survey of London" under the name of the church.

The number of churches in the City and Liberties of London (exclusive of S. Paul's Cathedral) that existed before the Fire was 108. Of these, thirteen within the City, and nine within the Liberties thereof, survived the Fire, while eighty-six churches were destroyed. Of the latter number fifty-one churches were rebuilt, and the remainder of the parishes, thirty-five in number, were annexed to the new churches.

A most useful list of "Printed parish registers," by Dr. Marshall, will be found in *The Genealogist* for July 1885, (New Series, vol. ii., No. 7,) which may be advantageously referred to for information on this subject.

The following table has been carefully compiled from various sources. The dates of registers are taken from the Return of Parish Registers in England and Wales.
