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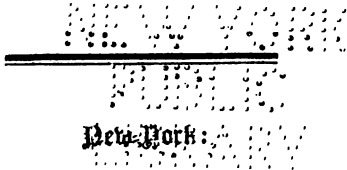
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It was the intention of the Compiler to have given a Catalogue *raisonné*, at least of the *most important* books in the various branches of literature. He had always considered this as a *desideratum* in the United States, and for this purpose had for several years been consulting authorities, and making references.
