2. Steady state

In this section, we consider the case where the system is in a steady state. The system is described by the following set of equations:

$$\begin{aligned} \dot{x} &= Ax + Bu \\ y &= Cx + Du \end{aligned}$$

where x is the state vector, y is the output vector, A is the system matrix, B is the input matrix, C is the output matrix, and D is the direct transmission matrix. The system is in a steady state when the state vector x is constant, i.e. $\dot{x} = 0$. In this case, the system equations reduce to:

$$\begin{aligned} 0 &= Ax + Bu \\ y &= Cx + Du \end{aligned}$$

The steady state output y can be expressed as a function of the steady state input u . This is done by solving the first equation for x and substituting the result into the second equation. The steady state output y is given by:

$$y = (C(A - B^{-1}A)^{-1} + D)u$$

The matrix $(C(A - B^{-1}A)^{-1} + D)$ is the steady state gain of the system. It is denoted by G . The steady state gain G is a function of the system matrices A , B , C , and D . It is important to note that the steady state gain G is only defined if the system is stable, i.e. if the eigenvalues of the matrix A have negative real parts.

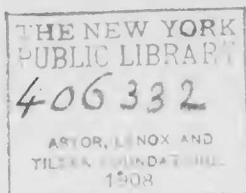
